

Leon H. & Blance C. Nennett: ** Commence on the westerly side of said Flint Street at an iron pipe driven in the ground at the southeasterly corner of the Thomas N. Easton homestead premises, so known, thence run North eighty-four and one half (84%) degrees West, (course taken in 1884) by said Easton premises, to a point fifty-six (56) feet and eight (8) inches easterly from the easterly side line of land of the Orin B. Thompson premises, formerly, now believed to be owned by the heirs of the late Constance Dardoni; thence right angle to the southerly from the above named course of the Easton-land, and by a jog in said Easton-land line, seven(7) feet and eight (8) inches, to an iron pipe driven into the ground; thence westerly and on a course bearing the same as the above mentioned and still running by the Easton homestead, to the aforesaid Thompson or Dardoni premises; thence Southerly, and by the last premises, to the hardware -store lot of Wales & Hamblen Company and Cumberland Lodge N. 30 I.O.O.F.; thence easterly by said store-lot and by land owned by Gertrude E. Hamblen, and once by said Easton, to said Flint Street; thence northerly by said Flint Street to the point thereon of commencement and bound first mentioned. Leon H. & Blanche C.
