UNITED STATES IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS

Passengers should carry with them such documentary evidence as will establish their identity to the satisfaction of the United States Immigration Officers whose duties require them to examine all passen-

gers entering the United States from Canada. Birth certificate where born in the United States, Tax Bills, Bank Books, showing deposits overa term of years, Naturalization Certificate or affidavit certifying to their continuous residence in the United States since prior to October 1, 1906, regardless of whether any record of their entry into the United States exists ir not, and if arrival was after October 1, 1906, aliens must be able toproduce proof of legal admission, otherwise they will be refused admission to the United States.
