you seen anything about a General
John Winslow? He was commander

in Bowdoinham Ridge church.

Father told me that when he
was in medical school at Bowdoin
he use to visit his cousins in
Bowdoinham on week ends. I
remember that he some times stayed
at Eben Lancesters who he called
Uncle Eben, he married Maria Preble
Grandpa Prebles oldest sister.
he also spoke of a Uncle Zebulon
Preble who must have been
a Gt. Uncle (brother to Alex.)

I think Pa. knew a lot about
the Prebles and he would tell
about his visits in Bowdoinham
Ridge but I can not remember
the names of any others except
Humphrey & Harmon 2 uncles
who lived in Charleston.

I don't think Aunt Lute knew
much about the family as every
time she would give a different list

would have been too old to have
been Grandpa Prebles brother
Could have been an uncle.

I must have got that name from
Aunt Lute. The town clerk of
Bowdoinham and I had it figured
out that Alex. father was Zebulon
also that Alex had a brother
Zebulon who was the Uncle
Zebulon Pa talked about.

But that is all guess work.
There were several Prebles named
Zebulon. In the church there
were 3 pews near together, one
belonged to Alex. Preble, one to Zebulon
and another to a family named
Alexander. Do you see any
records of Bowdoinham? If you
can find that a girl named Alexander
married Zebulon Preble in about
1760 to 1770 you would have the
story of Alex. Preble.
