This morning 2 <sup>yth</sup> July 1870 I gave to young Daniel How of P two pretty thick letters – Both for you – which I have had written about a month & this mon<sup>g</sup> took from my trunk to send by John Cox who will go this week — I write this only to bid you good Bye for I declare to you such a singular correspondence as I have [page torn]end with you and my mother for several [page torn] past has uniformly been the most provoking

employment I ever engaged in & must be relinquish'd — I never get an answer to my letters untill I have wasted more time & shoe leather running to the Post office than would pay for going after them in Person — & when I have got one It is usually about 10 or a dozen lines – written as if your salvation was at stake & every moment wasted in a correspondence with me was to punish'd <u>at least</u> by weeks of misery — at least was this your belief

hardly write with me or will lesi one short fille monino have Sead weeks The uture, Mall calculat. tenel on the

you could hardly write with more evident reluctance — or with less frequency than you now do — Only one short letter have I rec<sup>d</sup> since I have been in this place — & that has really caus'd me so much trouble that I have more than once wish'd it had never been written — every morning since have I left my business & ran to the Post office myself or sent the Boy — half a mile off to get a letter Rachel then promised to send me this I shall calculate one regularly receiv[page torn] letter from one or both of you at a particular time by mail — At that time, if you please to write me any more, – be the first of every month — now — mother — sister! — remember ! on the first of each month I shall expect from one or both of you a letter by mail — & as often as <u>you please</u> by private conveyance soon as you receve this I shall depend on an answer-- say about a week hence
