Flintstown June 29<sup>th</sup> 1791

I Received your letter of the 20<sup>th</sup> Inst. by my Brother John I was Sorry to hear that you was not well hope that you will recover your health soon I want very much that you should come down here if you did not stay any longer than to pay a Visit I have put myself out a great deal to procure a Place for my Father & you to live on ~~because it~~ because I thought that it would be better for you to live near me so that I might assist you if you stood in need and as your years renders you on the decline of Life I thought it would be some Comfort to you to live near a Child that would Esteem it a ~~comfort to~~ happiness to do any thing for you that would tend to make your life happy I should be sorry to find my Self Mistaken however I do not wish to urge you to do any thing against your Inclination if you are averse to Coming down here to live I wish I had known it before we had bought M<sup>r</sup> Lowells Place our Family are in pretty good health at this time and I expect to be at woburn with M<sup>rs</sup> Pierce after I have done my haying & Reaping if our Family are so that we can leave home and shall See you if you are there and talk with you on the Subject ----- Please to give my Love & Respects to my Friends and acquaintance from your affectionate Son Josiah Pierce
