Camp of the 5th Maine Bat'l-n July 12th @ Meridian D.C. 1864

Dear Father:

It is getting to be about time to hear from you so though I would write-as I have a few leisure moments. My health is very good at this time with the exception of a very bad cold I got coming from city Point on the Boat — I suppose you have heard of the Rebels Marching into C[?]'d and P.r. It is reported that they are forty thousand Strong - they are within six miles of Washington and yesterday they were fighting consider able. Ten thousand Militia has been ordered out around there D. C. We left Petersburg Saturday night

and look hunsports at city and landed est Washington Sent in a low mental of

and took Transports at city Point and landed at Washington at noon to day – Expect we shall have some sharp Fighting and Marching – It is reported that the Rail Road communication has been cut between Baltimore & Phil – I think it would be the best thing if the Rebels could destroy the Capital it would be more loss than to destroy the President for we have got so we don't think but little of him. We have not been paid for nearly five Months now and if you are getting along well, so that you could send me five dollars I think in a few weeks I could pay you well – for the use of it. but if it is not convinent to do so don't be afraid to say so I recd that other ten that Mother sent me.
