he term "love of nature" may be a bit high-sounding, but it is an everyday thing. It comes from a habit of noticing the plants and trees and birds and sky and landscape in all changes of season and weather. As you go to work in the morning you can see trees as beautiful as any Corot ever put upon canvas; you can hear birds singing as sweetly as ever sang that skylark, "in profuse strains of unpremeditated art" to Shelley's ear. Landscapes as fine as any that Thomson or Cowper or Wordsworth ever saw are to be had for the noticing. These things are ours: we cannot truly live without appreciating them; but we are often blinder to them than the sightless. With what wealth the lover of nature is storing his mind! Wordsworth looked on the daffodils:

"I gazed, and gazed, but little thought
What wealth the show to me had brought;
For oft, when on my couch I lie
In vacant or in pensive mood,
They flash upon that inward eye
Which is the bliss of solitude,
And then my heart with pleasure fills
And dances with the daffodils."
