or and Council, of which due notice will be given.
This Pension will be paid quarterly in money by
the Treasurer of the town of Vinal Haven
to Mary A. Calderwood
in person only, upon a receipt wherein she is identified by one of the municipal
officers of said town.

No sale, lien, transfer, or mortgage of any description whatever, of the whole or
any part of the Pension payable upon this certificate is of any legal or binding
force against either the Pensioner or the State, or said town of
Vinal Haven and the payment of this Pension, or any part
thereof, to any person other than said Mary A. Calderwood
or otherwise than in money and the full amount specified, will bar the reimburse-
ment of the same, or any part thereof, from the State Treasury.
