

Description: A warrant issued by the Town Selectmen of Baldwin for a town meeting to discuss the upcoming national election.

To Josiah Sanborn Constable of the Town of Baldwin G Greeting You are hereby Rquired In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to notify and Warn the male Inhabitants of Said Town Being twenty one years of age and upwards Resident In Said Town for the space of one year next preceding having a freehole estate within Said Town of the anual Income of three pounds or any Estate to the Value of Sixty pounds to meet at the Dwelling house of Mr Richard Fitch In Said Town on monday the fifth Day on november next at one O Clock In the afternoon to Give In their Votes for a Ninteen Electors of President and Vice President of the United States and for to Give In their Votes for A Representative of the people of the Said Commonwealth In the Congress of the United States fr the District of Cumberland

Given under our hands and Seals this Tenth Day of October AD 1804
