Bar Parlor, Store, Ashling Gallanari; bounded as follows; Northerly by land of Belle M. Bennett and land of Willie E. Crosby; Easterly by store lot of D. Eugene Chaplin, south-erly by Main St. and westerly by store lot of Clayton March, known as the Post Office Block. For futher reference see deed to Authur J. Noone by Perley Burnham dated Jan. 2, 1878 and recorded in Book 447, Page 131.

Beginning on the northerly side of Main St. at a point (12) feet west of the Frank Hamlin Shop, so called, on the line of said Main St. and running; thence North twelve degrees east seventy feet; thence south (78) degrees east (50) feet; thence south (12) degrees west (70) feet; thence northerly by said road (50) feet to the place of beginning. Being the same premises now occupied by the said Noone being a part of the premises divided to Joseph J. Walker, Charles B. Walker and Caroline A. Walker by their late father Benjamin.
