


Blanche Livingstone Monk.

A lot or parcel of land with the buildings thereon situated on the North side of Main St., so called, bounded as follows:— Commence on the said Northerly line of said Street and at a point thereon which is (25(feet westerly of the southwesterly corner thereon of homestead premises of Elizabeth M. Newcomb (once owned by Arnald F. Hill); thence run northerly and parallel with the westerly sideline of said Newcomb's homestead premises, (8) rods; thence easterly, parallel with said Street, (85) feet to line of land of May E. Littlefield, the last (6) feet of said course being by the northerly end line of said Newcomb Homestead; thence northerly and by said Littlefield's land, a stone-wall marking the line, to land of heirs of Isaac Webb; thence westerly, and by the line of said Webb's land, line being a wall, to corner of land of Richard C. March, formerly owned by heirs of Edward T. Alley; then southerly by said March.—Alley Land to the northersterly corner of premises sold by me to Georgia Brandt; thence easterly and by the northerly end line of said
