I have been very lucky in getting a first rate boarding place at Mr Shores, house on Maine street No forty + eight, a few steps from the Shorey,s they

they have twelve boarders and ^ all appear to be very good steady girls. I went to work in the spin room wednesday, it being just a week from the time I started from home, and I like the work a great deal better than ever ep I expected to when I s started from home I have had a very pleasant girl to learn with, and I think I could tend one side of a frame if I had it to tend, bit I do
