Dear Brother

I acknowledge the receipt of two letters from you, / one a Year, the other two Years old / just after my arrival from Mosco, where I have resided upwards of Seven Months; it was sent by a Ship called the Reliance Capt. Webber,

bound to Boston and directed to the care of Mr. Ingra<sup>^</sup> as you desired; I mentioned therein, that you should draw upon me for fivety pounds Sterling when ever you pleased. Twenty of which I must now desire you will give to our Brother Samuell, the remainder thirty you will apply for your Son's Schoolling, when you write, the yearly expence of which you will let me know. The Bill, you will direct, and with it a letter, to Mr. John Booker, who will have my Orders for paying it, in case of my not being here. I must likewise desire you will direct all your letters for the future, to his care. You will give my Love to the Whole Family. Wishing you all well am
