But we shall & make not the least don't soon have the french to revenge our cause and make them raskals pay four fold keep up your Mothers spirits she is a good woman and deserves a better fate - I would write you more but it is uncertain whether this will be delivered or not therefore shall conclude with wishing a happy sight of you all
