Hon<sup>r</sup> Sir,

The 3<sup>d</sup> Instant we arrived safe in this City, & the 8<sup>th</sup> inoculated for the Small Pox, I have attended the Congress every day yet, the ferries over north river were so obstructed by the enemy we were obliged to cross at a place called perks mill, where I see Col. Tash, who used me Exceeding well this day the Congress was informed by his Excellency General Washington, that the Enemy Decamp't from White Plains, & were Landing on the Jarsie Shore, They <sup>was</sup> taking every precaution, to prevent them from penetrating into the Country, by a letter from General Gales, Dated the 31<sup>st</sup> of Oct. - the enemies, a few days before, appeared in Order of Battle, & on his preparing to receive them return'd to their Camp - for better, & further information, & news I must refer you to the news papers, & you wont find more falshood in them then is passing through this City. - Before my arrival the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Col. Bartlet was set off, & I had not the pleasure to meet him, the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Col. Whipple is well please to take the trouble to present my compliments, to every member of the Honourable Council, & House, & Except the Same from him who has the Honour to be your most Obedient H. ble Ser<sup>t</sup>.
