AUGUSTA—The Capital City of Maine—at the terminus of the Maine Turnpike. Situated in the picturesque Kennebec Valley the rolling, ever-changing terrain delights the traveler. Located in Augusta is historic Fort Western, built in 1754, and now completely restored on the original site as a museum. The museum contains many relics of early Maine history including two of the bateaux used by Benedict Arnold's army in its unsuccessful march against the English forces at Quebec City.
 The Blaine Mansion, used as the Augusta home of Maine's Governor during his respective term of office, is open to the public Monday through Friday from 2-4 P.M. In the Capitol Building itself visitors are welcome from 8-5 P.M. daily except Saturdays and Sundays. The Hall of Flags in the main rotunda is an impressive feature one should not fail to see.

When in the State of Maine the Capital City is a "must" on every itinerary.
