Your Letter of the 12th Instant I have received, and how ever extraordinary my proposal to you, of having Capt. Ryder Mowat and the other five Men mentioned in my former Letter exchanged, for persons of their Rank and sent to this place prior to Brigadier Cushing's Exchange, may be deemed by you to be inadmissable according to your phrase, yet I now inform you in so far as it can depend on me, that no other Terms shall be accepted off, and truly it does not appear to me, you are Brigadier Cushing's friend, in hesitating a Moment, a Compliance to my proposal.

Your Strange Letter to Brig. Cushing I have delivered to him, the Liberties you take in that Letter, I have no doubt will on perusal be Condemned by your Board of Council. I expect you will be more Circumspect in your Writings in future. I am Sir
