Of Portland, in the County of Cumberland, hath, by and with the advice and consent of the Board of Immigration, appointed the said

And by these presents we authorize and empower him to have and to hold the within named office. Together with all the powers and privileges thereto of right appertaining, if he shall so long behave Himself well in said Office, unless sooner removed by our Governor, until the duties incumbent upon him, Under and by virtue of this Commission, shall have been discharged, and a report of his doing therein Made and returned to the Executive of the State.

year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy and of the Independence of the United States the ninety=fourth.
