My Dear Friend,

I rec^d your favor of the 4th Inst. on the 14th - Col^l Revere has promised to have the Boxes for the Mill on board Cap^t Fales to night-- the wheat is on board - by M^r Tuckerman + I have d^d the Capt. q^r hund^d best quills for you - Capt. Fales who brt your letter - told me you desired him to speak to me to get of M^r Osborne a 50 foot Box 10 by 8 glass for the meeting house - that is also sent on board by him - I rejoice in the pleasing prospect you have of a settlement with the people, and remain with much regard
