He is wanting: To Prove the Surveys in 1750 & 1751; — — — — — the Indians: on the 8<sup>th</sup> of Sept<sup>r</sup> 1750 Carried away 13 persons out of 16. from Swan Island & one from Richmond Fort: in Kennebeck river Samuel Goodwin: warned them of their Danger: the Night before — after Sun-down; — he got into — Richmond: Fort: about 10<sup>o</sup> Clock at Night: of September 7<sup>th</sup> 1750 with 8 men & him Self made 9. but 7 men in the Fort before he got in: there was A— 115 Indians: 15 went to— Swan Island & A 100 lay Round Richmond. Fort to take that but by taking — one Jenkins that went out of the Fort that— morning they inquired of him: where— Goodwin was— he told them— he had got: the [?] last night— with a Compeny of men:: they asked how Maney he Said he Could not tell for he was A beed &c: — The Kennebeck: Proprietors has Carried on their Settlements and at a great expense it being almost A Continuel — war: with the Indians &c Till Canada was taken and Subdued: &c: A. Copy taken in March 1795
