Whereas Webber Row of sd. Baldwin, yeoman on the 4th day of May 1804 before William Gorham

Esquire, one of the Justices of the Peace for our county aforesaid, recovered judgement against Joseph Sandbourn of sd. Baldwin yeomen

for the sum of six dollars seventy two cents debt or damage, and

four dollars forty two cents for charges of suit as to us appears of record, whereof execution remains to be done:

We command you, therefore, that of the money of the said Joseph or of his goods or chattels, within your precict at the value thereof in money, you cause to be levi ed, paid and satisfied to the said Row the aforesaid sums, being eleven

Dollars and fourteen Cents, in the whole; and also that out the money, goods or chattels of the said Joseph you levy one dollar + fifty cents more for this, honor writ / together with your own fees. And for want of such money, goods or chattels of the said Joseph to be by him shewn unto you, or found within your precinct to the acceptance of the said Row or satisfying the aforesaid sums, we command you to take the body of the said Joseph and him commit unto our gaol in Portland And we command the
