His Excellency
Gov. of Maine:

Your letter of the 14th is received this evening. I will endeavor to see Dr. Dow in the morning in reference to the qualifications of Miss Gowen as nurse in Hospital, and can obtain a situation for her without any doubt. Will write you of it as soon as possible.

I returned from Gettysburg late Saturday evening having been there with our wounded four weeks. The list of patients names, I had sent from there to Mr. Butterfield the names of those who have died there in any of the Corps or general hospitals, I took from the record of the Medical Directors the day before I left, and have them with me; also receipted for, and brought to W. [Washington] the effects of all who died from our State, in the 3rd Corps. This list I will send to Maine for publication as soon as I have time to copy it. I left our soldiers very reluctantly at Gettysburg; they needed my service much, and urged me to remain, but I had no instructions to remain.
