The above bounty will be paid twenty able-bodied men to fill the quota from Houlton, for Nine months; making the pay from 25 to 32 dollars a month, with clothing and rations. A Bounty of 100 dollars for nine months, is equal to \$400 for three years.

Persons wishing to enlist as above will apply to Adrian Vandine or J. H. Bradford of Houlton, Enlisting Officers.

At 9:00 o'clock A. M., for the purpose of enrolling all who wish to volunteer; and voting the above Bounty. All who enlist to fill the above quota, will be paid the above bounty as soon as mustered into service. A draft will be made for the above quota of men on Wednesday, Sept 10<sup>th</sup>, unless filled by volunteers before that time. All persons interested in raising the above volunteers are requested to be present at the Town Meeting on Monday, the 8<sup>th</sup> inst. at 9 o'clock, A. M.
