Then there was also the churn that fitted inside your washing machine... and as far as I know, the Maytag washer was the only one who put them out. And they probably were in the early 50's... or it was the early 50's I had one. You just took your agitator out of your washing machine, set your churn where your agitator would be, and then the paddles inside would turn as the agitator did, and it was the turning of that paddle inside that would separate your buttermilk from your butter in the process of churning.
