To the tourist or sportsman who has once visited this beautiful sheet of water, no words in commendation of its attractiveness and unrivalled beauty are necessary; but for those who are seeking for the very best place in which to pass a few days or weeks, away from the dust and turmoil of city life, we would recommend a trip to Moosehead Lake.

Travellers can take the Eastern and Maine Central Railroads to Dexter, Me., or Sanford's Independent Line of Steamers and Bangor & Piscaticus Railroad to Guilford, where from either place a pleasant ride brings you to Greenville at the foot of the lake, where may be found two cosy hotels, the Lake and Eveleth Houses; both of which are provided with attentive hosts, good food and clean beds, the three great requisites for comfort. Faithful and genial guides can be procured here, and all the requisites for sporting or sight seeing.

From Greenville a sail of two hours in the fine little steamer Twilight, winding among the many islands with which the lake abounds, and the tourist is landed at the foot of Mount Keneo, where very comfortable quarters may be found with Mr. Dennin, who is always successful in his efforts to satisfy those who trust themselves to his care.

But our space is too limited in which to set forth the numerous attractions of this delightful summer resort, and we can only advise those who can do so, to go and see for themselves.
