



Hamburg Dec 2 1861

Dear Wife

I have been waiting a few days in hopes I should get a letter from you before I wrote again but I have not received any from you here and it has been about a fortnight since I wrote so I will write again in hopes it will find you and Bertha and all the rest as well as it leaves Monroe & myself We shall in all probability be discharge the last of this week but I shall do then I cannot say yet I had a letter from the owners the other day they thought then New York would be the best place to go with the Ship if freights kept up but that was uncertain I shall look for another letter from them in a few days but if I should not hear from them in a few days I shall take in Ballast and make the best of my way to New York I should like the idea much better if it was summer time this going to the westward in the winter time will not be very pleasant I do not expect. But I shall have one thing to comfort me that we shall be homeward bound and if we are fortunate enough to keep clear of the Pirates so much the better I shall write again as soon as I get a letter from or before we leave
