I, George F. Mahoney, Insurance Commissioner for the State of Maine, have caused the buildings and premises described in this order to be inspected by Horace S. Jose Supervising State Fire Inspector. Upon inspection and report, I find as follows:

(1) that for want of repairs, by reason of age or dilapidated condition, or from other cause, the buildings or structures on the premises are especially liable to fire, and are so situated as to endanger other property or the safety of the public;

(2) that there is combustible or explosive matter in or around the buildings which is dangerous to their safety;

(3) that inflammable conditions exist which are dangerous to the safety of the buildings on the premises;

(4) that other conditions exist which are dangerous to the safety of the buildings on the premises.

The premises which are the subject of this order are located in Bridgton at 140 Main Street County of Cumberland and State of Maine and are bounded and described as follows:
