Dont be startled George, I have not come to afflict you with a letter. The evidence you have given of a disposition to close that concern, however blind I would be for a time, cannot with propriety be longer disregarded. Nevertheless I am very desirous of seeing you. Will you meet me in Boston on the 18th inst I shall be there at that time — Maine, has on the whole, done nobly— I think there can be no doubt of the Generals re-election by an overwhelming majority

There will be much clapping of hands about the late Charter election at Albany. The Regency ought to have carried that, tho' to be sure it dont amount to much. Are you married? — yours as formerly
