My dear Nellie,  
But very little has occurred since I wrote to you last. After our little flurry of excitement on John's isld. we have relapsed into our old routine. One event however is worth recording. I believe I didn't tell you that we got several trophies on our Expedition. My share was a couple of rebel sabres, one of them with a wooden scabbard. The Genl got some chairs and a fine looking glass. But the greatest prize of all was a light wagon very much dilapidated but still whole, there was a harness with it that with a very little trouble we made strong enough to hold. and so I have been lately having fine rides on this magnificent beach. Poor Bramhall at first didn't relish

We have really been having cold weather. I have written so much about balmy breezes and tropical verdure that I imagine you thought as I did that it was always summer here. Such
