A unique spot on the banks of the Kennebec River, in the heart of the Pine Tree State. Directly on the International Highway, Route 201 - the Arnold Trail between Quebec and the sea. 27 miles up river from Augusta, 60 miles from Bangor, 59 miles from Lewiston and 85 miles from Portland.

## What it is

An endowed philanthropic and educational institution providing homes and schools on 1600 acres of farm land, for 155 deserving boys and 60 deserving girls. \$400. a year gives another boy or girl this chance in life. Family life in cottages. Non-sectarian. Foursquare in purpose - physical, social, intellectual and religious development. Founded in 1889 by G.W. Hinckley.
