Dear Brother-

I hardly know what to say about going into Mr. Anderson's Office — At first it struck me very favourably – but on second thought, I feel a little suspicious that it might not be exactly proper. It is doubtful wether, with my present knowledge of practice, I should be able to do all Mr A– expects of a student— I might too find it inconvenient to be so confined, as it would be necessary to give the proper attention to his business.

Besides these reasons, there is another that leaves me still more in doubt—The peculiar relation in which Mr. A stands to Mr. Longfellow. It might possibly injure the feelings of the latter if I should go into the office of his successful competition. This may be all surmise, and if I thought it was, I should certainly take up with Andersons offer. But considering, how matters stand, Father thinks I had better go in with Mr. L—. I am perfectly satisfied with Mr Anderson's terms, and he will find no trouble in finding young me to take up with them.
