Washington, January 4. 1830

My Dear Pierce

I am now awaiting for my final Instructions & then shall proceed forthwith to take command of the USRSch "Detector" [?] Anderson, Genl Ripley & others called on the Sec^y & President after my Commission was made out and attempted to get it Revoked but in vain the President informed the Gentlemen it was his wish that these Vessels should be commanded by Young men & officers from the "Navy" I have no doubt but that, there will be @ Hell of @ row kicked up by Sturdifant & his friends. but tell him when he wants things not done send his Boy but when he wants it done go himself. My officers are not as yet appointed and I shall endeavor to meet the views of the Sec^y by getting @ Reefer for a first Lieutenant but the others shall be appointed by the advice of Gen¹ Chandler whose views I shall endeavor to enter in to & please as far as possible - I wish you was here to crack @ Bottle of wine with me, & wet the "Parchment" but time enough I have not received any letters from Adelaide I think there must be some in P for me Give my love Ann & the family
