

Augusta Oct. 3. 1833

Friend Pierce – I read your communication a few days since & have endeavoured to obtain lodging for yourself & wife next winter, but I regret to say that there is not at present a decent private boarding house in the whole city of Augusta. I regret this the more in as much as your wife intends to spend the winter with us. It would afford my wife & self great pleasure to have you become inmates of our family while you remain in town, were it not for particular domestic reasons, which you will undoubtedly understand being a married man — I could even now procure you a situation, but the distance wanted be a serious objection, it being half a mile —
