

Blue hill September 11. 1819

Whereas at a meeting of the first Baptist Church  
in Blue hill held on thursday 9th of Sep 1819  
they did choose & appoint; Brothers: Andrew Wood  
Eben Hinkley, Israhel Hinkley, Andrew Witham  
George Stevens and Jonathan Buck, a committee  
to take in to consideration the complaint of the  
Rev Mr Jonathan Fisher, against Eliza Day,  
a member of the said church: and to report to said  
Church; and we having attended that Service, be-  
lieve, to report; and do report, that whereas the  
said Eliza Day has reported that the Rev Mr Fisher  
did in the year 1812 baptise his infant child on  
the day of its death, in her own house, she then  
living in Mr Fishers family; which report Mr  
Fisher denies; and says he did not baptise the child;  
and he being a man of truth and piety we have  
no reason to doubt of the truth of his assertion;  
but that she had some reason from what she  
saw and heard, to believe that the child was baptised,  
but we do believe that she was mistaken; but that she  
had no intention to injure Mr Fishers character, nor  
did she willfully report a falsehood by reporting  
the same; but that she was too assertive in her  
assertions; and that she be reproved & admonished  
by the Church to which she belongs.
