In the year of our Lord One thousand, Eight hundred and Thirtyseven
 An Act to incorporate the Saco Water-power Company.
 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That Samuel Fales, Charles Bradbury, Charles W. Cartwright, Samuel Batchelder and their associates and successors be and they hereby are constituted and made a body politic and corporate by the name of the Saco Water power Company, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities, provided in the several laws of this State regulating manufacturing Corporations, and are authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate, not exceeding in value at any one time the sum of five hundred thousand Dollars, and the same may improve, leave, sell and convey, as other proprietors and owners of real estate may lawfully do. And said Company are authorized to carry on at Saco Falls in the towns of Saco and Biddeford, the manufacture of Cotton Wool, Iron and other metals and materials, and may erect and construct upon their own lands and privileges the necessary works mills and machinery for that purpose, provided that said works are so constructed as not to impede the navigation of Saco River, nor affect the rights of other individuals or Corporations on said River.
