



Brunswick (Me) June 4th 1831

Gentlemen

We acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 12th of May last in which you say that Sarah Darling alias Sarah Truman, alias Sarah Cooper whom (you call an inhabitant of this town) has become chargeable in your town as a pauper, and that you have charged the expenses and shall continue so to do to this Town. In answer we wantd inform you that we made inquiries and are satisfied that the said Sarah never had a settlement in this town, we therefore refuse to remove or provide for her or to pay any expenses which has arisen or which may arise on her account or for her support.
