between the two lines under a flag of truce, both armies are strongly intrenshed in five or six lines of battle our scurmish line and theirs are with in six rods of each other in many places but are hid from each others sight the most of the time

I suppose I have got fifteen days longer to serve I received a letter from you the other day I have not time to write more from your anxious husband my love to you all
