Description: Marshall Phillips on Spotsylvania

Virginia May 11th 1864

Dear wife I will write a few lines to you to day hopeing that I may get a chance to send it noing that knowing that you must feel very anxious about me but Diana I am alive yet and am not wounded it is 9 days to day since we crossed the rappadan we have had eight day of continued fighting we our regt. have not hadd a very desprit fight untill yesterday three regt of our brigade was orderd to charge on a rifle pit and some batteries and Dear wife I did not expect to ever come out a live but by the blessings of god I did am yet alive I must stop we are orderd to march Dear wife good by

May the 13 we had the most survier musketry fight yesterday that durin we have had during the nine days of continued fighting
Mr. Edmunds was was wounded o the tenth when we charged the rebel rifle pits we lost a hundred men killed and wounded in the charg we have less than a hundred men now in the regt Dear wife it looks hard our time being so near out but may god spare my life Joseph Edmunds left arm

has be'n ampitated near the sholder he appears to be doing well I shall write to his wife as soon as I can I him that, I would I have not time to write more we are orderd to march M S Phillips
