Assassination of Pres Lincoln he was shot at half past ten when I came off from watch at twelve I heard the news but did not fully believe it untill the next morning

I was at the Preside^tial Mantion Tuesday and saw the remains was at the Capital Wednesday when the posession arived there the coffin was very costly the remains left here Friday morning in a car fitted up for the occasion it stoped all business in the city for a while dont work to hard take care of the children with respect, M.
