I will write you a few lines this morning I am yet a live but am a most tired and we are haveing a very hard campaine probly you have learned the causalities in this regt before this time I write to you the tenth of this month but our mail is

dont know whether h she will get
it or not I understand he is
doing well he was at Fredericks
burge, at last accounts but is at

Washington probly before this time and likely she will hear from him there has been more or less fighting evry day since the

fourth of this month there has some been some of the hardest contested misktry battles that we have had during the war mostly in the thick woods with very heavy loss we have lost over half of our regt since we left winter quarters in killed and wounded I have recieved but one maile this month and then received two letters and two papers we some expect a mail to night there is quite a fight a going on now about a half a mile from here we are expecting to be called in to line evry moment Lee has intrenched himself in and around Spotsylvania Court House it seems as if this is to be a sontinued campain untill our time expirs it looks hard prehaps I shall have time to write more to night
