Description: Letter concerning "Boxer" prisoners, Eastport

Fort Sullivan Eastport 21st Sept 1813

Sir

This day I was called on by Capt Brown to give permission for him to proceed to the British dom inions with several passengers (non combatants) captured in his Britanic Majestys Brig Boxer – they had a pass from you which I duly respected – soon however a gentleman called at my quarters & informed me that one of the gentlemen thus permitted to pass as having been only a passenger on board the boxer was in fact a Lieut in the 64th Reg. of British Infty – which the Lieut Allen readily confessed to me: but added that he did not conceal his being in the enemys employ from you – my doubts were so strong on this subject, that I thought proper to detain him as a prisoner of war, and have parolled him at his request he is now gone to S^t Johns – The cartel regulations require that in case an officer be paroled, immediate information be given to the agent of government appointed for the ex -change of prisoners – presuming that you are the agent I have addressed this — There are at Fort Obrun ~ (Machias) nearly thirty prisoners of war: your deputy in that place has refused to be at any trouble respecting them & does not receive them nor reciept for them when land -ed – I am not instructed to take charge of the & have directed the commanding officer at Machias to recieve no more unless he was called on to do it by you or your deputy or the collector or his deputy – or some person specially appoint -ed by government as agent – I am under the necessity of keeping a learger force at Fort Orbrun than I should were these prisoners not there, which incommodes me much – I have heard it regretted that some of your deputies did not show a greater disposition to attend to business & have heard their negligence attributed to their known disaffection

towards government — Motives of friendship towards you have induced me to inform you of this common rumor — I have stated L^t Allens case to the proper authority I have the honor to be most Respectfully your Obd t Serv t ~
