Description: Letter seeking Young Teazer prize money

New York August 11th 1815-

Sir,

Two of the Seamen formerly belonging to the Private armed Schooner Young Teazer. Capt Dobson, have requested me to write to you for information respecting their prize money. Their names are John Mitchell & John Piles. the first entitled to 1 ½ shares. & the last to 1 share – they are two of the Eight that were saved at the time shew Blew up – They have just arrived here from Prison and are in a destitute situation living on the Bounty of their friends- I have been informed that the money is in your hands. if it is, have the goodness to inform me as soon as possible. and also what course they must pursue in order to obtain it. Mr. Wm. I. Waldron of this City who was one of the owners of the Young Teazer informed me that \$26.000 was the nett proceeds of the prizes. sent in to Portland — – I am very respectfully
