General -

Col. Kimball says the application for my detail was referred to him by Genl. Dwight & that he approved & forwarded it immediately & I think it must have reached New Orleans last week.

The Col. wished at once to make sum of it – to make a detail here or push it through.

The Col. had me reported on detached service when the application was approved—

I found my company in much better condition than when I last saw them—

Lt. Webster is making himself quite popular with them –

The desire to occupy the splendid position you so kindly offered me is so strong - that <u>if</u> you should find the detail made or <u>advise</u> me to return under <u>the circumstances</u>, I shall not be able to refuse, but will do as you advise –
