Description: W.B. Adams on expense of furlough

Camp Russel <u>Va</u> Nov 20th 1864

Sister Dora

I recd your letter to day and was very glad to hear from you – also one a few days ago have ans'd them both or shall soon as I get this done. We are in camp near Winchester or **Kearnstown** and the Troops have all had orders to build up winter quarters but we cant tell how long we shall stay we have got our tents up – three of us in a tent with a good Floor and Fire place shall paper it if we stop here long we have not so good a chance here as we had last winter on account of wood any way I guess we can make it do -

for Spid you were having & a cold weather me han handom very coop - but now it is man as Demmer and gut lain you went one to com home on a holough the winter Of Ep mile gin out don Andonylos 10) would som it would orsh me hos hundred dollarsor more and as long as the Holles an all well it would be better miles from I hav not deen the me to go there May go and see their fymith I ho is all a con mit This finds with down no you

you said you were having some very cold weather – we have had some very cool – but now it is warm as summer and quite rainy

You want me to come home on a Furlough this winter – I expect they will give out some Furloughs but dont think I shall get one even if I can unless some of the folks should be sick for if I should come it would cost me two hundred dollars or more and as long as the folks are all well it would be better not to go - The 10th [?] are here but I have not seen Mr. Skillins Boys yet - I believe it is not Further for them to come here than for me to go there but still I may go and see them by and by This is all I can write this time so write soon as you
