Bodoinham Sept 24/63 to Mr Watson Sir. I take the liberty to adress a few lines to you in regard to my clothing bill. there is something like \$25 – due me from government. i could not obtain a settlement before leving Washington on account of not having my descriptive list. if you will take the trobble to write to the 19 maine reg Co B lieutenant Ellis Comanding & obtain my descriptive list & colect the amount due me I will satisfy you for all trobble & expense that you are put to. my health is very poor. the change of climate affects me

been exetreenily cold since i presume you home his from our election. we home elected her bones by out least full returnes yet. your the you election Jon but my intervew with him was rother breef i cited him youre position & the genral leelings of the Soldiers hourds w. E likewere goine my openion ors i word verry favourably impressed with your opearance wold remember you. & elicle To every thing in his power for you

verry much. it has been extreemly cold since my return.
