Date of Creation: July 19, 1793

Description: Native American Pere Pole's deposition about the river names along the Androscoggin River within the Pejepscot Land Claim. July 19 - 1793

I Perepol of Lawful age testify and say that the
Indian name of the River was Pejepscook from Quabacook
what is now called Merrymeeting bay up as far as amitgonpontook
what the English calls Harris falls and all the river from
Harris falls up was called ammoscocongon and the largest
falls on the river was above rockamecook about twelve miles
and them falls have got three pitches and there is no other
falls on the river like them and the Indian you'sd to catch
the most salmon at the foot of them falls and no
salmon was ever seen above them falls, and the
Indians yous'd to say when they went down the River from
Rockamecook and when they got down over the falls
by Harris they say now com Pejepcook.
