My dear Father

I have a few moments to spare so I will write you a few lines. I am dismounted, and am at Warrenton Junction expecting to go up on the next train to Alexandria to the dismounted camp I was dreadful sorry to have to come to the rear just when a fight was to come off for I want to be in all the battles I tryed to go but the Capt could not let me for my horse had been condemned and

and was ordered to be  
taken to the rear. our  
regiment - was not engaged  
so I heard. if we go to  
Alexandria I have half  
a mind to get a chance  
in the War Department - as  
clerk I could do it - easy  
and never need go to the  
regiment - again. I have not  
wholly made up my mind  
as to this but I think  
it would be a good chance  
for me. I like soldiering  
in some respects - and then  
I do not - I may possibly  
get a Sergeants berth in  
a few months but - that -  
is no inducement - for me  
to stay in the regiment - if I  
can get a much better  
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to try hard to get me a  
2<sup>d</sup> Lieutenantcy in the 2<sup>d</sup> Me Cav  
get all you can in my favor  
and perhaps Talbot would  
help you Vose would I  
know and John Kilby too  
try hard and tell me the  
prospects - get me one if it  
costs \$200, or over \$300 for  
if I could get a commission  
I could then get enough  
money to carry me to school  
long enough, I have somewhere  
about 30 dollars coming to me  
for clothing which I did  
not draw. I am going to  
have a new suit made when  
I get to Alex<sup>a</sup> it is by far  
the cheapest way and then you  
can draw 55 dollars clothing  
money and have good clothes  
The Capt - that is in charge

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of us has telegraphed to  
Washington to find out when  
we are to go we will doubt-  
less go to Alex<sup>a</sup> where we  
may stop for 6 weeks, shall  
try to see Mary.

Saw Bill yesterday all  
right.
