Enrollment produced the selection of eight applicants being selected. In the fall of 1968 our first class of 7 girls and 1 boy started under the direction of Mrs. Sereen Taylor. were

In the spring of '69 the results were evaluated by the hospitals and we were told to go ahead with an expanded program. The girls now enrolled in our two health classes you see before you on the stage.

Never in the history of our educational system has the student had a more wonderful opportunity to prepare himself for a promising career in the area that interests him the most.
