I assure you now much enjoyed.

We have just completed a pretty thick 6 days in the trenches at a very hot corner of the line in wet & cold weather. We all had some very narrow escapes, I say all, but unfortunately some did not escape as we had many casualties. It is a sad sight to see the many many graves just behind & sometimes in the trenches.

However I think things are on the move in the right direction.

I am glad you all got across the Atlantic safely, it must have been a very anxious time.
