Description: Israel Washburn wrote to Edwin Stanton to urge him to appoint Col. George F. Shepley, as Brigadier General of Volunteers.

Hon E. M Stanton Secy of Navy,

Sir

I recommend the appointment of Col G. F. Shepley of the 12th Maine Reg^t for Brigadier General of Volunteers. And I do it for these reasons, Col Sheply who left, perhaps the largest & most lucrative practice, of any lawyer in the State to aid in putting down the Rebellion – is one of the ablest men in Maine, & possessing great executive ability has extraordinary qualifications for the position.

He is now acting Brig^r Gen^l of the 3^d Brigade in the Department of the Gulf -
